### **Town Manager's Office—Dawn Francis, Town Manager**

Per the Town of Colchester's Code of Ethics: "Public Service is public trust. The affairs of government must be conducted openly, honestly and impartially, so that the public's confidence in the integrity of its municipal affairs shall be maintained."

Restoring the public trust and ensuring accountability is essential at this time for our community. Given the recent events and ongoing criminal investigation of Tyler Kinney, I have directed that an external review of the Colchester Police Department's operations and all policies/procedures that relate to this matter be completed. This review will augment the external audit of our evidence room and related policies and procedures that is already underway. Chief Morrison and I are confident that this additional external scrutiny and subsequent recommendations will help CPD be an even stronger organization and ensure that best practices are in place going forward.

### **Police Department—Jennifer Morrison, Police Chief**

November was a busy month for CPD. We responded to approximately 700 calls for service and made contact with over 200 operators during traffic stops. We arrested a total of 34 people for 40 crimes including trespass, DUI, aggravated domestic assault, larceny and unlawful restraint. A double fatal traffic crash on Route 15 early in the month also added to the heavy workload.

We have had our first snow/ice road conditions of the year and we were busy with vehicles off the road and crashes. Please remember to leave extra time for travel in inclement weather, to fully clear your windows before heading out on the road and to leave extra space between vehicles to allow for longer stopping distances on slippery road surfaces.

CPD is currently hiring police officers and public safety dispatchers to replace personnel that have moved onto other endeavors. If you know someone who might be interested please refer them to Lt. Jeff Barton 264-5542 for more information.

### **Rescue and Technical Rescue Squads—Amy Akerlind, Rescue Chief**

From November 6<sup>th</sup> through December 3<sup>rd</sup> Rescue received 88 EMS calls and 56 people were transported to the hospital. We provided 14 mutual aid requests and turned over 7 calls to other agencies while we were already on a call.

The first morning of deer season, we received a call at 5:30 am, for a male who had fallen 30 feet out of his tree stand. The patient was approximately 1 ½ miles into the woods and not able to move on his own. This type of call is one of the more difficult situations we deal with. We cannot bring the ambulance to the patient, so we have to decide what supplies we need to bring in, how to treat the patient and keep him warm. With the help of the Technical Rescue Team and fire departments we were able to transport the patient from the woods. From the time we received the call, it took approximately two hours to get the patient into the hospital. Fortunately the patient did not have any life threatening injuries.
