**Town Manager's Office—Dawn Francis, Town Manager**

At the Public Hearing of July 22, 2014 on the proposed amendments to the Firearms Ordinance, the Selectboard decided to postpone any action to allow further research and reconsideration of unique information brought forward by residents. The Firearms Task Force will reconvene for a meeting on Wednesday, September 17th at 6:00 p.m. in the Kirker Room at the Colchester Police Department to consider the input from the public hearing, and proceed with further research and reconsideration of the proposed ordinance. The meeting is open to the public and all interested people are encouraged to attend.
