

Greetings from the Burnham Library. Though it may be cold outside, it's always warm at the library, especially in front of the fireplace. We'd like to let you know about just a few of our upcoming programs:

- Tax Help with AARP Volunteers Starting in February, the AARP's Tax Aide Service volunteers will be filing taxes for seniors and lower income households once again. The service is free! Appointments take place on Saturdays (from 9:15 am-1:15 pm), call 264-5660 to sign up.
- Tax Forms The library will be receiving a range of 2015 Federal tax forms in the coming weeks, along with a limited amount of instructions. Unfortunately, just like last year, the State is not making any forms available through libraries. In either case, you'll be able to download forms online, or request them online or by phone.





- Tutoring Tutoring is back. Students from the Albany College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences (Colchester campus) tutor students in reading, math, and science at the library. The program is focused on grades 1-6, but tutoring is available in other grades for certain subjects. Sessions take place on Mondays from 6-8 pm, Wednesdays from 4-8 pm, and Saturdays from 9 am-2 pm. There is no fee for this service, and you can call us at 264-5660 to sign up or for more information.
- Story Times We have a wide range of story times going on. Preschool Storytime is every Monday and Thursday at 10:30 am, while Toddler Storytime is every Tuesday, also at 10:30 am; if possible, please call 264-5660 to sign up for either of these. And every Saturday is drop-in Story Time at 10 am (no sign up needed). And Pajama Story Time will be on Wednesday, Feb. 17 at 6:30 pm.
- Write Now! (Young Adults) Monday, Feb. 1 at 6:30 pm. Do you like to write? Ever want to take a stab at National Novel Writing Month? Come join us for writerly encouragement, prompts, snacks, and literary mayhem. We're strategizing about word count goals to write our novels (or long poems, or D&D character sheets, or whatever) and making journals to celebrate. Teens 12 & up.
