

- The State Primary Election: Tuesday, August 9, 7 am to 7 pm. All vote at Colchester High School Gymnasium. Since it is a primary you will vote for only one party. You will receive three ballots (Democratic, Republican, and Progressive). You will vote one party ballot and deposit the two unused ballots in a separate box. This is the same for absentee requests. We will mail three ballots to you; you will vote only one party, and you must return the two you did not vote with the voted ballot.
- Taxes are due August 15th. If for some reason you have not yet received your bill please contact the Town Clerk. Check your tax bill carefully to see if you received the residential rate if the property is your primary residence. If you have questions please contact us at 264-5520.

Police Department Jennifer Morrison, Police Chief

A snapshot of our activity in the past four weeks:

- responded to 1150 calls for service
- arrested 30 people for 31 crimes
- applied for and executed numerous search warrants for cases related to arson, larceny, embezzlement, fraud and sex crimes
- completed a quarterly check on all registered sex offenders in Colchester
- participated in and staffed the Town's 4th of July events
- staffed Raftapalooza event
- prepared for Statewide disaster drill "Vigilant Guard" which is currently ongoing
- finished comprehensive rewrite of the Town's ordinances related to traffic

Rescue and Technical Rescue Squads Amy Akerlind, Rescue Chief

Summer continues to keep us busy. The winter months showed a downward trend in calls, most likely due to the lack of snow and fewer cars crashes. However, the first couple of months of summer have started to make up for the lower winter call volume. In June we had 115 requests for service. As of July 28th, we have had 114 requests for service. Since our last newsletter, we have been received 142 requests for aid! Seven calls were turned over while we were already on a call and we responded to 23 mutual aid calls while other agencies were on calls.

Both Rescue and Technical Recue have also been active with summer events is town. This included being on standby for the Raftapalooza event at Thayer Beach on the 23rd; participation in a state-wide disaster drill on July 29th, and for standby coverage for the Colchester Triathlon on the 31st.

Highlights of the Colchester Selectboard meeting of July 26, 2016 The following actions were taken:

• The amendments to the Zoning Ordinances of the Town of Colchester, related to Lakeshore zoning and identified as Supplement 39, were adopted. They will go into effect on August 16, 2016.
